Introduction

As in buying real estate, three principles are crucial to understanding a person's words: location, location, and location. We cannot make sense of what someone says unless we understand the context in which his or her words were uttered. To use the real estate comparison, Jesus – in his speaking – did not just move into an empty part of town and begin to build all the houses himself. He moved into a neighborhood already built up: in fact, one that had been occupied for many centuries by the same people – his people, the Jews.
